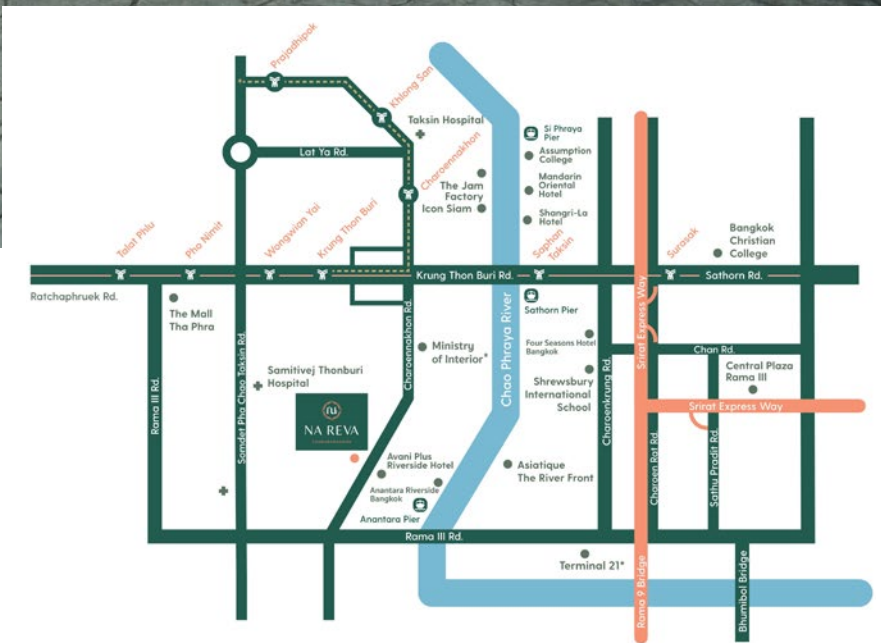

Charoen Nakhon



◆ *There are few places in the world that make it possible for visitors to see its urban areas via boat. Charoen Nakhon is a charming neighborhood situated in the Thonburi community on the western banks of the Chao Phraya River. Thonburi was the capital of Thailand for a short time in 1768, after Ayutthaya was destroyed by the Burmese. After the capital was moved across the river, Thonburi became a separate city, but now it is one of many districts that make up the city of Bangkok.*

The riverside neighborhood can be reached via a handful of BTS stations, or by boat, which is oftentimes a faster and more authentic way to see the city. While many tourists who venture this way come to stay in one of the stunning riverside hotels or to see the iconic Wat Arun Temple, this ever-developing area has so much more to offer. With untouched local villages hugging the narrow waterways, fascinating museums, and quaint local markets, there are plenty of interesting things to do in Charoen Nakhon.





◆ Charoen Nakhon certainly has a great waterfront setting and is one of the better riverside dining options in town. The main roads and their side streets are filled with plenty of authentic restaurants selling meals for less than 50 baht. It is known as one of the best places in Bangkok to get a taste of that “Old school” Bangkok flavor.

Lhong

Lhong is a historic port and warehouse in siheyuan-style (Chinese courtyard architecture). It was built in 1850 as a port for overseas shipping from British Malaya, mainland China, and British Hong Kong by Phraya Pisansuphaphol. In 1919, the Wanglee family acquired Lhong. In October 2016, the family started renovated Lhong as a tourist attraction and a new landmark



Sirimahannop

Sirimahannop is an exquisite dining experience that will transport you back to a golden era of Thai heritage. Soak up the ambiance of old Siam as you unwind on an authentic trading vessel that dates back to the reign of King Rama V

Iconsiam

Iconsiam's Alangkarn zone is designed by 3 leading Thai artists. Not be missed is The 15-meter high waterfall created by Ghesa Water & Art, the creator of The ICONIC Multimedia Water Features, the longest water dance in ASEAN.

The waterfalls in this area are like raindrops that create a paradise on the wet soil that has nourished the lives of Thai people for a long time.



Cultural Heritage



◆ Thailand's cultural heritage is diverse, created on the bases of beliefs and faith in religions of various ethnic groups, which have been related to and coexisted with other groups of Asian people peacefully and harmoniously, indicating the civilized nature of the Thai people.

Bangkok's most famous landmarks are along the Chao Praya river, accessible with untouched local villages hugging the narrow waterways, fascinating museums, and quaint local markets, there are plenty of interesting things to do along Charoen Nakhon.

Wat Pho

Wat Pho is one of Bangkok's oldest temples. It existed before Bangkok was established as the capital by King Rama I. The temple is first on the list of six temples in Thailand classed as the highest grade of the first-class royal temple



Wat Arun

Wat Arun ("Temple of Dawn") is a Buddhist temple, derives its name from the Hindu god Aruna, often personified as the radiations of the rising sun. Wat Arun is among the best known of Thailand's landmarks. The first light of the morning reflects off the surface of the temple with pearly iridescence. Although the temple had existed since at least the seventeenth century, its distinctive prang (spires) were built in the early nineteenth century during the reign of King Rama II.

Yaowarat Road

Yaowarat Road is the main artery of Bangkok's Chinatown. It has been the main centre for trading by the Chinese community since they moved from their old site some 200 years ago to make way for the construction of Wat Phra Kaew, the Grand Palace. Nearby is the Phahurat or Little India.





Museum & Art

◆ Bangkok has a small but very vibrant art scene. Since most of the city's small private or commercial galleries promote Thai and regional artists, a day of gallery-hopping is a great way of experiencing the local arts scene. Luckily, Charoen Nakhon is considered to be a concentrated area for Museums & Art in the capital.



River City Bangkok

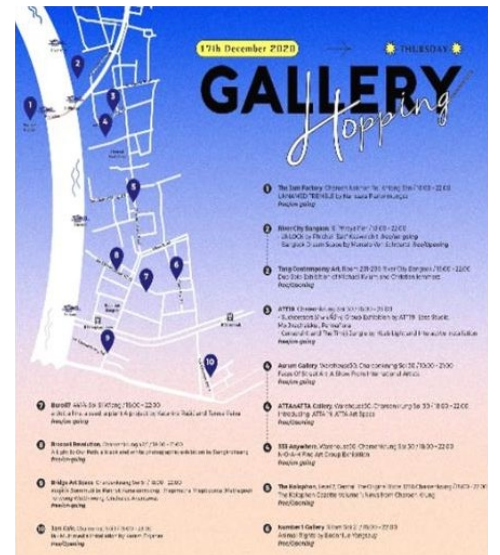

The Jam Factory

Situated within an old former factory and warehouse, The Jam Factory is a multipurpose complex that includes ten or so different shops and design firms. The complex attracts Bangkok's young culture lovers and includes an architectural firm art gallery, along with a cafe, bookshop, clothing shop, general store and restaurants.

The gallery hosts group exhibitions by young artists and designers, while live gigs are often held in the spacious outdoor area. Held on the last Saturday and Sunday of the month, The Knack Market attracts large crowds and provides visitors with the chance to purchase unique goods and healthy cuisine directly from their makers.

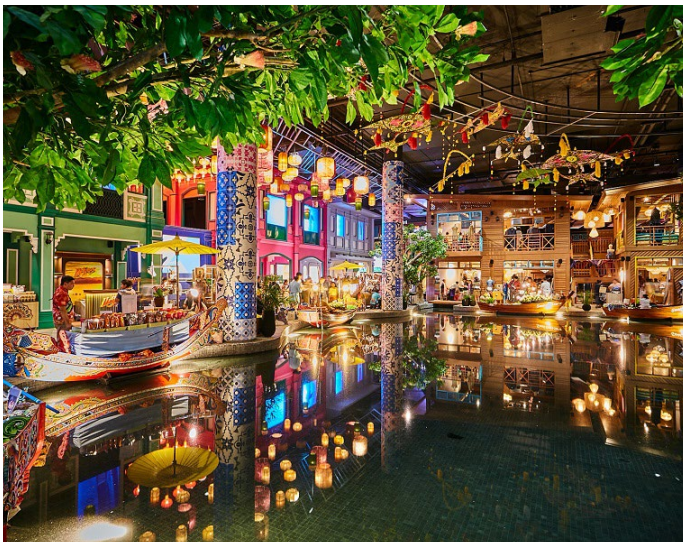

Hospitals

A Royal Thai Navy hospital, providing medical services to service personnel and their families. The hospital has a total of 500 beds, and also serves as a teaching hospital. Recognized as one of the largest hospitals in Charoen Nakhon and surrounding areas providing fair low cost treatments



Samitivej Thonburi Hospital, one of four primary branches in the hospital network, is committed to maintaining Samitivej's standard of excellent quality healthcare for local citizens, expatriates and international patients. In this 150-bed facility they offer state-of-the-art medical equipment and advanced technological tools. Their doctors are often certified abroad, as well as in Thailand, and many have years of practical international experience.



St. Louis Hospital is a private, non-profit hospital in the reign of King Chulalongkorn by His Excellency Louis Way Mook, Prime Minister of the Roman Catholic Church of Siam.

The 344-bed hospital has modern medical equipment. Doctors and nurses specializing in all fields. The hospital is comprised of key patient care units, including the Critical Care Unit (ICU), Cardiovascular Disease Unit (CCU), modern operating rooms Cardiovascular Catheterization Laboratory A dedicated place for end-stage care and a place of meditation to support all religions



Education

◆ Bangkok's International schools follow a foreign curriculum, the most popular being British and American systems. The standard of education is therefore on good level and meet the ISAT standards (International School Association of Thailand), ONESQA (Office for National Education Standards and Quality Assessment in Thailand) paired with the applicable international accreditations required. Thailand's prominent Private and Public schools are built on years of excellent education, nurturing future leaders and business owners.



Bangkok Christian College

Bangkok Christian College is a private boys' school and has a longstanding reputation as one of the most prestigious and highly selective schools in Thailand. The school has about 400 academic staff, both Thai and foreigner, and 6,000 students in 12 grades. Although it is a Christian school, only about five percent of students are Christians. Most students are Buddhist, but it is popular with students of all faiths due to its strong reputation.



Suksanari School

Suksanari School is a girls school that provides education in both primary and secondary education. Somdejputthajarn (Nuam Putthasaramahatera), opened the school inside Anongkaram Temple in order to provide education for females, who had historically had not been emphasized in the Thai education system.



Shrewsbury School

Benefiting from a truly inspiring and purpose-built environment on the banks of the Chao Phraya River in the very heart of Bangkok, Shrewsbury is a well-established and highly successful school that sets the benchmark for international schooling in Thailand.

The values of a Shrewsbury education, inspired by the eminent boarding school in England,



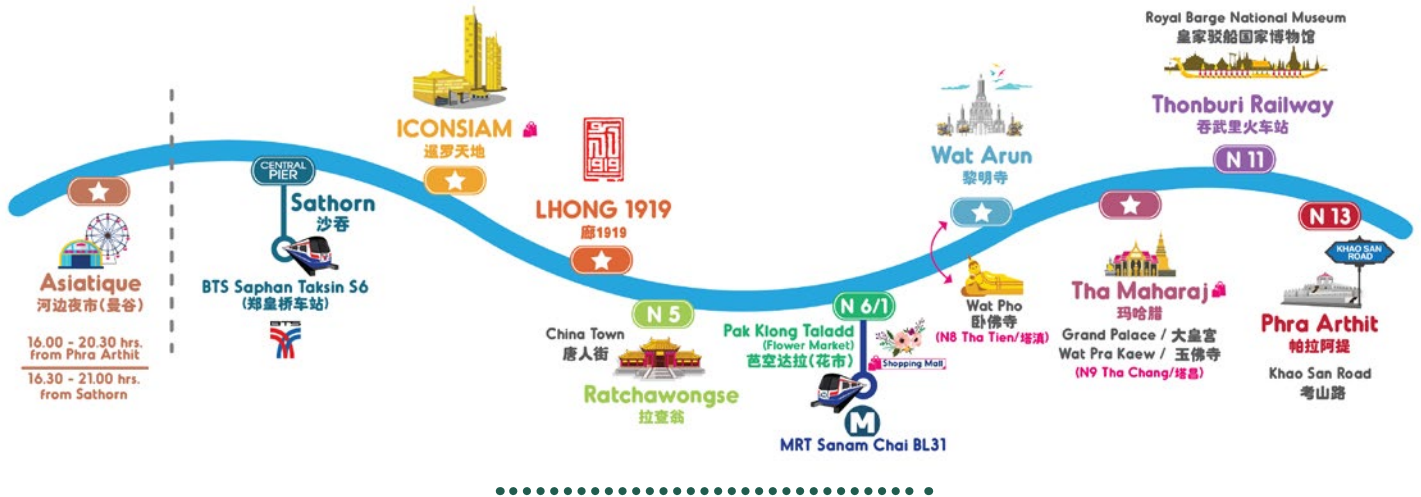

The Chao Phraya Tourist Boat

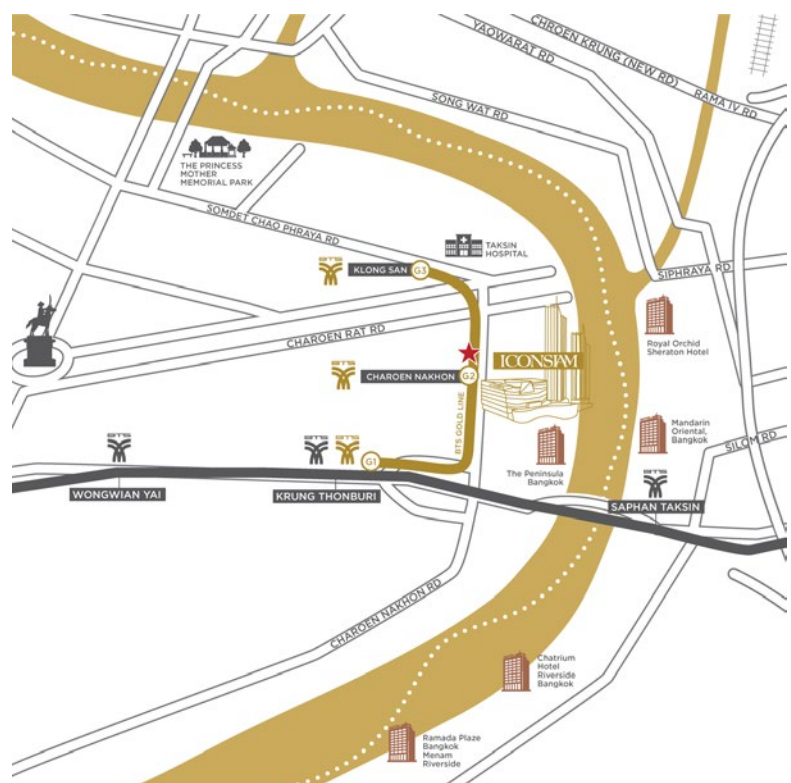
Sightseeing has never been so easy! The Chao Phraya Tourist Boat is the original hop-on-hop-off boat service, run daily between 9:00 - 20:30. The boats depart every 30 minutes from 9 piers, including: Sathorn Pier (BTS Saphan Taksin-S6), ICONSIAM Pier, LHONG 1919 Pier,

Ratchawongse Pier, Pakklong Taladd (Yodpiman) Pier, Wat Arun Pier, Tha Maharaj Pier, Thonburi Railway Station Pier, and Phra Arthit Pier. For only 180THB you can use the service unlimited for a day, Children ride for free.



BTS Gold Line

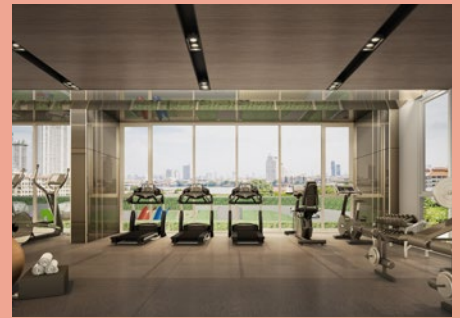

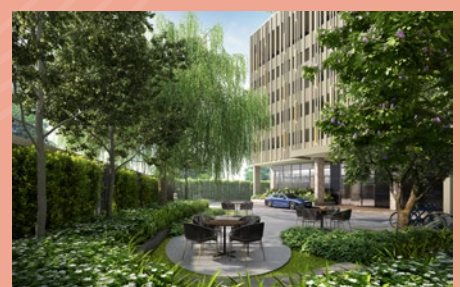
